It's not just about fuelling planes; it's about fuelling hope.

It's with gratitude to God that I reflect on the past year as the CEO of MAF Australia. Stepping into this role has been a privilege, and I am deeply thankful for the warm welcome and support from the wonderful team and supporter base.

It's been a big year of change, welcoming a number of capable and enthusiastic newcomers to the team while farewelling a number who leave behind a legacy of service to MAF Australia. Amidst the change, I've been proud of the commitment of our staff. Together, we have been able to recruit 11 people to the MAF International program - the largest number in a single year yet.

Your dedication to prayer and your commitment financially has allowed us to continue in our mission to bring practical help and spiritual care to people in isolated communities.

In particular, our Fuel for Father's Day campaign this year was a resounding success thanks to the participation of more than 530 churches. Through the 5,600 gifted jerry can cards, we raised a total of \$280,000. That translates to 112,000 litres of fuel - enough to put planes in the air for an astonishing 1,800 hours.

That's not just a number, it's a lifeline for the communities we serve.

In March this year, I had the privilege of spending some time with the team in Arnhem Land. It's an honour to serve these remote communities, to build connections, and to work alongside Indigenous Australians demonstrating the practical and passionate care that Jesus has for the Yolngu people.

All of us at MAF are very grateful for your support to fund this work. It is your generosity that is enabling generational change by helping to provide access, education and opportunity for the young people in these communities.

Lastly, I would like to acknowledge your contribution in funding the solar panels for Wewak. Once installed, these solar panels will provide 24/7 power to the MAF families and operations in PNG, enabling MAF's long-term support in the area.

We thank you for your prayers and your partnership. It's not just about fuelling planes; it's about fuelling hope. You are collectively delivering basic needs, providing crucial medical support, and sharing the life-changing message of Jesus.

Fuelling life saving flights



Thanks to your generosity, MAF in Timor-Leste, in collaboration with the Ministry of Health and National Ambulance Service, conducted 207 medevacs in 2023.

As the sole air ambulance service in Timor-Leste, MAF serves as a lifeline for patients in remote areas, transporting them to Guido Valadares National Hospital in the capital city of Dili—the country's only hospital.

Among these missions is that of a one-year-old boy, William, who was suffering with a severe lung condition, requiring urgent specialised medical care. With every second being critical, MAF's intervention was vital as the child's home on Atauro Island was separated from the medical facilities in Dili by 30 km of water.

The child's father expressed his gratitude to the pilots, stating, "We are immensely thankful to MAF because, at that moment, the ocean waves were treacherous, and we were unable to transport him by boat."

In 2023, MAF in Arnhem Land undertook 641 education flights, flying a total of 693 hours and carrying 2,553 passengers to and from homeland schools.

That is an average of 16 flights a week during school terms.

Driving to school could consume up to 40% of the week! These flights facilitate teachers' travel to homeland schools and enable high school students to board at Garrthalala's Makarrata College.

"If it wasn't for MAF, these students wouldn't be here, we wouldn't be able to run our program," says Secondary Programs Teacher, Sophie Grambeau. "There's been times where we've seen pilots walk into a community that's one kilometre away to check if the students are there, so they don't miss the plane for school."

MAF Technologies continue to support remote churches to promote transformation and strengthening of faith in Christ through Bible distributions.

Addressing PNG's literacy challenges (61.6% literacy rate), MAF actively enhances Bible accessibility by delivering solar-powered audio Bibles to isolated northern communities. This initiative allows villagers to easily listen to God's word in their native language at the press of a button.

In October 2023, in collaboration with Fellowship of National Bible Churches (FNBC), MAF PNG flew hundreds of these Bibles to Morobe Province. Accompanying these audio Bibles, one of FNBC's pastors offered an opportunity to go deeper in discovering the

He said: "The printed and audio Bibles have been an instrumental tool to help comprehend the Word of God and I am truly grateful to MAF Technologies for their ongoing support." As a result of this initiative, more than 170 gave their lives to Christ and were baptised.



Fuelling help, hope and healing





The Mareeba hangar carried out 38 maintenance jobs on 17 different aircraft in 2023.

Engineering Administrator, Faith Blanch says "2023 was a productive year for us. We had planes from Arnhem Land, Papua New Guinea, and Timor-Leste at the MAF Training Centre here in Mareeba. We had engineers from other country programs around the world join the team here to share their experience and expertise."

The maintenance hub in Mareeba plays an important role in keeping MAF planes flying, and sending skilled engineers to support our mission to bring hope, help and healing to isolated communities.

A key maintenance event in 2023 was the work undertaken on the Indonesian registered aircraft PK-MAD. This was a joint effort between MAF US Engineers and Pilots, the Mareeba team, and the externally contracted aircraft painter.

Another key milestone for the team was the purchase of VH-LZT which is being used as a training aircraft by our Mareeba Training Centre.

Thank you for supporting the ongoing maintenance work at the Mareeba hangar over this past year.






